Kids doing online school at home, parents working from home, and decreased physical activity and social isolation had created a mental and physical crisis for many. Recruiting volunteers to help was difficult, but with the help of a Telus Grant to get the kids back on court we were able to have a successful season. It brought amazing joy to see so many kids having fun again. The highlight was twin teenage boys who had been home schooled during Covid, who came to the courts and didn't speak a word for a few weeks. They hadn't been with other kids for a couple of years. By the end of the season they were laughing and high fiving the others and their tennis improved so much. It was such a reward seeing them progress and having fun again.

Thank you so much to my family who is always there to help put up windscreens, teach tennis or maintain the facilities. I am so blessed to have the help to make our community a healthier one. A special thank you to my amazing volunteers who make the program fun for everyone and our board members who have always supported our initiatives through the years. I always look forward to our meetings and discussions. You are terrific.

A special thanks to Tony Milo who had the courts at Hillcrest pressure washed, and patched which brought new life to the place. It always feels like home when I am on the courts and I love how it is such a positive, fun and amazing part of the community.

What the future holds

We had applied for a grant to have lights at Hillcrest but were unsuccessful, however we will try again as we feel that we need this in order to expand our programing especially in the fall when it gets dark so soon.

Orientation programs for volunteers, and staff are being worked on so that all participants whether you are a volunteer or participant in our program will feel welcomed, safe and have fun. This is extremely important to us as we work on creating healthier communities.



A Special Donation in Memory of Evelyn Hustwit (1936-2022)

Evelyn would be so pleased with how our organization is recruiting many women and girls to our program. I was able to meet with her husband, daughter and grandchild who were in attendance and it was such a privilege to meet and chat with them about Evelyn.

Evelyn died suddenly on August 13, 2022. She was a top class tennis player from an early age, playing locally and eventually playing internationally for many years. She played at Wimbledon in 1957, 1958 and 1961. She was also the Canadian seniors Women's Champion in doubles and singles for over 40 to over 80. Her highest world ranking was 5th in mixed doubles and 8th in over 80 singles. I loved watching her play and now her memory will be instilled in our organization as we continue to promote tennis to more women and girls. It is truly a special gift with so much meaning to us.






